

Requests for Changes in Resident Complement Review Committee for Allergy and Immunology

The Review Committee for Allergy and Immunology reviews temporary and permanent (by total) complement change requests as needed, between full reviews of a program, and outside of its formally scheduled meetings.

A temporary increase in resident complement for up to 90 days does not require approval from the Review Committee and should not be submitted in the Accreditation Data System (ADS). Temporary complement increase requests of greater than 90 days must be submitted through ADS.

Requests for changes in complement require prior approval of the designated institutional official (DIO) before submission to the Review Committee through ADS.

To submit a request for a change in the total approved resident complement, a program director or coordinator must log into ADS, select “Complement Change,” enter all required information listed below, and click “Submit Request to DIO.”

- Educational rationale for the change
- Major program changes since the last academic year
- Response to any active citations
- Current block diagram
- Proposed block diagram

After the DIO approves the request, it will be forwarded in ADS to the Review Committee for a final decision.

Note: it may take up to 30 days to receive the final decision regarding a request.

To request a permanent increase in complement, a program must have a status of Continued Accreditation or Continued Accreditation without Outcomes. Programs with statuses of Continued Accreditation with Warning, Initial Accreditation, Initial Accreditation with Warning, or Probationary Accreditation are not eligible for a permanent increase. A site visit may be required for a complement change request, depending on the details of the request.
